



KISUMU COUNTY PROFILE USAID PRIVATE SECTOR ENGAGEMENT PROGRAM

Nestled in western Kenya on the shores of Lake Victoria, is home to the third-largest city in Kenya, serving as its administrative hub. With a population of approximately 1.15 million, predominantly comprising the Luo ethnic group, Kisumu County thrives on agriculture, particularly rice and sugarcane farming, and a flourishing fishing industry. Additionally, it serves as a vital transportation hub, with a major airport and extensive road networks supporting its economic activities.

HEALTH STATUS

Kisumu County has shown significant improvements in maternal and child health indicators. The proportion of women attending at least four Antenatal Clinics during pregnancy increased from 86% in 2017/2018 to 94% in 2021/2022. In the same period, the number of women giving birth through skilled birth attendance increased from 62% to 85%, positioning Kisumu as one of the most covered counties in skilled birth attendance. Maternal Mortality ratio (MMR) reduced from 497/100,000 live births to 343/100,000 live births, while the Caesarian rate coverage remains within the World Health Organization limits of 10-13%. Human Immunodeficiency Virus/Acquired immunodeficiency syndrome (HIV/AIDS) treatment coverage for adults was 84%, and for children, it was 72% in 2021. The county has also made progress in Tuberculosis (TB) control, with a 57% decrease in bacteriologically confirmed Tuberculosis (TB) cases from 2018 to 2022.



CHALLENGES FACING THE PRIVATE HEALTH SECTOR

- Lack of proper coordination and engagement mechanisms between public and private facilities.
- Human resource management and retention issues.
- Inadequate financing leads to frequent shortages and mismatches of commodities.
- Nonadherence to standard reporting indicators and use of tools.
- Lack of financial support for printing reporting tools.
- Noncompliance with standard operating procedures, policies, and guidelines.
- Knowledge gaps in commodity management.
- Uncertainties regarding Universal Health Coverage (UHC) and its implementation.

KEY AREAS OF FOCUS

- Establishment of a coordination mechanism for USAID-funded partners supporting private sector engagement interventions.
- Formation of a Market Technical Working Group/PPP through a comprehensive review of the Universal Health Coverage (UHC) roadmap and implementation.
- Deployment of a framework for engagement with the private sector for Public-Private Collaboration (PPC).
- Consideration of privatization of certain services in the public sector.
- Facilitation of discussions on quality improvement initiatives within the private sector.
